



## Community Themes

### **Open Space, Parks and Sustainability**

Open Space, Parks and Sustainability include both natural open spaces such as Coyote Hills and recreational areas such as hiking trails and parks. Also included in this theme are natural features such as creeks, the climate and weather. Sustainability includes green building practices and restoring and preserving environmental quality.

### **Sense of Community and Community Character**

This theme includes the qualitative characteristics of the community and how community members and groups interact. In addition to sense of community and community character, this theme includes diversity, community cohesion and identity, and governance and communication.

### **Economic Development and Vitality**

Economic Development and Vitality includes the existing and future types of businesses within the city, access to jobs, affordability, housing options and opportunities and creating a destination place within Fullerton.

### **Cultural Resources and Community Activities**

This theme includes the physical and intellectual resources in Fullerton that promote learning and cultural enrichment, as well as community participation. Components of this theme include educational resources and facilities, activities in the Downtown, fine arts, cultural activities, theater, and community activities and organizations.

### **Community Services**

Community Services are the facilities and services provided within the city for the benefit of the entire community. Components of this theme include City-provided services, public partnerships, recycling programs, the cost of services, adequate and equitable services, maintaining infrastructure and facilities and technology.

### **Community Health and Safety**

Community Health and Safety includes public safety, cleanliness, seismic safety, medical services, emergency services and addressing crime and homelessness.

### **Community Design**

This theme includes the physical design and aesthetics of Fullerton. Components of community design include historic buildings, a rural feel in parts of the city, and the quality and character of architecture.



## **Mobility**

Mobility is the ability for people to move freely within the city and from Fullerton to other parts of the region. Included in this theme are transportation options, location and access to the region, bicycle and pedestrian systems, traffic congestion, and parking and parking structures.

## **Growth Management and Density**

Growth Management and Density addresses how Fullerton is going to accommodate and manage growth and development. Components of this theme include scale of buildings, growth management practices, density and land planning.
