## 1. DOWNTOWN PLAZA

121 E. Wilshire Ave.

## 2. FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH

109 E. Wilshire Ave.

**Sanctuary** (located at the West end of the building) –

Fullerton College Community Band, consisting of students and community musicians, will perform a variety of traditional and contemporary wind ensemble music throughout the evening. (7:00-8:00)

**Fellowship Hall** (located at the East end of the building) –

## 3. FULLERTON MUSEUM CENTER
